Bible Study

This passage contains some very harsh statements. Jesus' response to the first would-be follower is that – before deciding to follow Jesus – he should first count the cost. The closing sentence is even harder, 'No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.' This is a Jesus who leaves no room for compromise. Not only must we follow Jesus, whatever the cost, but we must do it immediately and wholeheartedly.

Questions:

- Read Luke 9:51-62. Read it slowly three times. The first time listen/look for a word, verse, or phrase that jumps of the page. Who do you most identify within the story?"
- John started his message connecting and comparing Jesus to the Old Testament person of Elijah. What did you learn that was new? How did it impact your view of Jesus?
- Jesus rebuked James and John when they wanted to call down fire on the Samaritans. What does this teach us about how we should respond to those who reject us? How do you often want to respond to those who oppose you or reject you?
- As Jesus started His journey to Jerusalem, He encountered three people who wanted to follow Him. Each person represents a different barrier to fully following Jesus.
- Why is it hard to say no to different things? Have you ever looked to your past thinking it was better before following Christ? Why is it easy to romanticise the way life used to be? What is God inviting me into through this passage? What do you feel like God has been saying to you throughout.
